

REAL ID ACT

Visitors and contracted personnel with a driver's license or state ID from the five states mentioned below will **no longer be able to acquire unescorted access to JBER or any other DoD installation.**

Exceptions: Enhanced Driver's Licenses from Minnesota and Washington State will be accepted.

Individuals who do not possess a driver's license or identification card compliant with the REAL ID Act and do not possess an acceptable alternate identification credential **must be escorted by a DOD card holder while on the installation, via trusted traveler, or will be denied access."**

Maine, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana

REAL ID Act will not impact military members, dependents, retirees or other common access cardholders.



REAL ID Act compliant credentials:

- United States passports/United States passport cards
- Permanent Resident card/Alien Registration Receipt Card (Form I-766)
- Foreign passports with a temporary (I-551) stamp
- An employment authorization document that contains a photograph (Form I-766)
- Current/valid driver's license or identification card issued by a state or outlying possession of the United States which is in compliance with the REAL ID Act of 2005
- Identification card issued by federal, state, or local government agencies that are REAL ID act compliant.
- Minnesota identification card holders, can have access to federal installations if their driver license bear a small red, white, and blue U.S. flag logo on the front.
- VA health identification card issued by the Dept of Veterans Affairs
- Merchant Mariner card issued by DHS/U.S Coast Guard
