Description

Fort Greely proudly serves as an integral part of the Nation's Ballistic Mission Defense System and is a National Security Asset. Fort Greely's installation mission is mid-course missile defense (destroying threat missiles in their midcourse phase). Fort Greely is located on the east side of the Tanana River. It is bordered on the north by private land, to the south by recreation land and to the west by the Donnelly Training Area (DTA).
