

Land Capabilities

Description

The Joint Pacific Alaska Range Complex (JPARC) has 2,490 square miles of land space with 1.4 million acres of maneuver land, providing the space and varied terrain and weather needed to train in support of diverse missions and threats. The mountainous terrain, along with cold weather and long periods of daylight, provides realistic training conditions for ongoing operations, such as those in Afghanistan. And with an increased international focus on the Arctic, the JPARC provides a unique opportunity to train units to execute military operations in that region.

The JPARC faces limited encroachment and provides the space needed to train jointly from individual skills up to complex and realistic large-scale engagements. JPARC land space supports specialized training in the following capabilities:

- Mountaineering/Glacier
- Arctic
- High Altitudes

- Littoral
- River
- Urban
