Juveniles may be outdoors during curfew hours if the sponsor has written permission from the 673 MSG/CC. Examples include for employment or an organized base/civic activity that require them to be outside during curfew hours. Juveniles may also be outside past curfew hours if in the company of their sponsor or guardian. The unattended youth policy is established to supervise youth activity, prevent misconduct, and ensure safety. Supervision is defined as close proximity to continuously monitor the child and provide immediate verbal instructions.
