





- How do I request shipment or storage of my HHGs?
 - All customers must register for a DPS account through: https://www.militaryonesource.mil/moving-housing/moving/pcs-and-military-moves/
 - Create an application for each shipment request in DPS, upload signed documents and orders into DPS. To check status of your application, please email the Travel Center Org Box - edftravel@us.af.mil.
- When should I submit my HHGs request?
 - 30+ days prior to desired HHG pack/pick-up date is best. You must have Orders in hand.
- Requesting HHG & UB pack/pick up dates
 - Customers must provide 7-day spread when requesting a move Pick-Up Date.
 - Pack dates occur prior to the pick-up. How many Pack Days? plan for ~4,000 lbs/day
- Separating or Retiring?
 - Come see us or call for a counseling appointment at (907) 552-1797
 - FAQ: How long do I have to ship HHGs?
 - Separatee 180 days from effective date of separation
 - Retiree 3 years from effective date of retirement



JBER Weight Restrictions



Alaska is Considered an Overseas Duty Station

- A single or unaccompanied member (regardless of rank) should contact the Base/Post Housing Office, prior to shipment of household goods. The member(s) may be authorized to reside off base, at which time their PCS orders should reflect full JFTR weight allowance authorized.
- Unaccompanied Air Force members E-1 through E-4 with less than 3 years of service are weight restricted to 500 lbs of UB by air or 700 lbs of HHG by surface.
- If less than 3 years of service and requesting an exception to the weight restriction must contact Unaccompanied Housing at JBER to acquire a Dorm Non-Assignment Letter prior to shipment of HHGs.
