

FAP Roles and Responsibilities:

FAP Serves:

- Active duty (AD), activated guard (Title 10 & 32) and reserve members and their eligible dependents
- Unmarried intimate partners (UIP) of AD members - Limited services are provided which include FAP clinical assessment, safety planning, DAVA services and referrals to local resources
- Retirees on a space available basis
- Inactive guard or reserve members are eligible for DAVA services and referrals to local resources



FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM

Air Force FAP personnel provide a continuum of services from prevention to treatment designed to build community health and resilience and promote family, community, and mission readiness by reducing domestic abuse and child maltreatment.


Outreach

Our outreach department provides information and referrals for JBER and community resources and collaborates with JBER and community resources for base-wide programming. They also help facilitate the classes offered by FAP such as Dads 101, Change Step and Women's Empowerment Group.

FAP Outreach is able to provide customized briefings to squadrons or units on any topic that promotes healthy families and mission readiness. The outreach department also provides squadron and unit support through training and collaboration for ALL first time Sergeants, Commanders or frontline.

Family Maltreatment Services

Families experiencing domestic violence or child maltreatment receive therapeutic treatment in order to return to mission readiness.



New Parent Support Program (NPSP)

The New Parent Support Program (NPSP) is a FREE service designed to help new parents, who are expecting or adopting, meet their challenging and changing roles as mother, father, and family.

It is a voluntary program available to military beneficiaries who are expecting a child or who have a child under 3 years of age.

- Home or office visits with a registered nurse
- Prenatal and fetal development education
- Childbirth education
- Breastfeeding support and education
- One-on-one baby care basics education
- Community resources
- Information on infant & toddler growth & development
- Basic parenting skills

Victim Advocate

Family Advocacy seeks to aid military families in acquiring the means necessary to alleviate domestic violence. Our Domestic Abuse Victim Advocate (DAVA) works to promote a supportive, safe environment for persons directly affected by abuse. Restricted Reporting

FAP offers restricted reporting of partner abuse. Restricted reporting is a process that allows an adult victim of domestic abuse the option of reporting an incident of domestic abuse to a specified individual without initiating the investigative process or notification to the victim's or alleged offender's command.
